



“THE FUTURE OF OHIO” GOVERNMENT REFORM

- **HOUSE BILL 25** Consolidates state agencies, streamlines state government.
- **HOUSE BILL 65** Requires performance budgeting by state agencies and requires performance audits of those agencies. This audit will identify wasteful spending and inefficiencies.
- **HOUSE BILL 66** Creates the State Government Efficiency Commission. This commission will hold our state government accountable and curb our bloated, inefficient government, while expanding the private sector in Ohio.
- **HOUSE BILL 120** Reestablishes the Legislative Budget Office. Restoring the LBO will help keep the legislative branch transparent and efficient by providing public review and nonpartisan oversight.
- **HOUSE BILL 240** Seeks to address fraud, waste, and abuse in the Medicaid system. This bill will examine the competence of each Medicaid funding item while repairing inefficiencies.
- **HOUSE BILL 282** Requires the Office of Budget and Management to host a searchable database on their website so the public can easily access details on state awards, its amount, funding source, and recipient of the funding.
- **HOUSE BILL 388** Requires conference committee reports of appropriations and revenue bills to be made publicly available for 48 hours before they are considered by either chamber. This will help maintain government transparency and accountability.
- **HOUSE BILL 436** Authorizes a state agency to outsource goods or services to a private contractor; requires state agencies to prepare a business case before executing an outsourcing contract; creates the Council on Efficient Government to review business cases and issue advisory reports; and requires the governor to select goods or services for possible outsourcing.
- **HOUSE BILL 430** Bases the total amount that the administrative departments spend on the salaries or wages of their employees or changes in the Gross Domestic Product of Ohio.
- **HOUSE BILL 454** Requires the creation of a tax database and calculator to allow individuals and businesses to determine their current tax rates and potential tax liabilities.
